Project Title: Muskegon Co. (in our watershed area) Adopt-a-Stream program

Priority Issue Addressed: Stream Protection

Project Goal(s):

1. Obtain water quality data
2. Keep stream clean from trash
3. Monitor stream for pollution sources, etc.

Summary of Project

Adopt-a-Stream group chooses a stretch of stream to monitor and report to the MRWA. This will be an ongoing project. One adult from the group would need to become a trained water monitor (MiCorps program) – MRWA provides an annual training.

Role of Students:

- Specific roles that students would carry out as part of the project
- Description of products, and their purpose, that students would be completing for the partner organization, e.g. signage, brochures, presentations to board, data collection reports, videos, photos

Students –

- Collect macroinvertebrates from 300 foot section of their designated stream (trained adult will be responsible for verifying results) – results need to be submitted to MRWA
- Conduct one or two cleanups on entire adopted stream section using a tally form provided by the MRWA to record each piece of trash – results need to be submitted to MRWA
- Monitor adopted section of stream periodically to determine any sources of pollution and other detrimental factor. They could also take stream temperature readings, record wildlife seen, determine tree cover, etc.

Role of Project Partners:

MRWA –

- Oversee project and obtain data.
- Report to funder.

Estimated Project Cost:

MRWA has funding to purchase at one set of monitoring equipment for each group.
