Project Title: Newaygo Co (watershed area) Shoreline Restoration

Priority Issue Addressed: Storm water reduction

Project Goal(s):

1. Reduce storm water in watershed lakes
2. Education property owners
3. Promote native plants and natural shorelines

 - Participate and assist in workshop - introducing the project and educating landowners about native plants and natural shorelines
- Project –
 - Assist with landowners in planting plants (possibly assisting in preparing lakeshore)

Role of Project Partners:

MRWA

- Oversee the project
- Conduct the workshop with assistance from students
- Approve any letters, articles or publicity developed by students
- Work with landowners (assistance from students)
- Report to funder
